SCHOLARSHIP FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS MAJORING IN THE FIELD OF NATURAL RESOURCES

The Minnesota Prairie Chicken Society has established a scholarship for college students majoring in the Natural Resources and closely related fields of Environmental Sciences, Ecology, Forestry, Fisheries or Conservation Biology.

The \$500 scholarship is open to students who have completed their third semester (or equivalent) in Natural Resource fields. The scholarship will be awarded directly to the student to help allay the cost of college studies. Applicants can secure a copy of the application at www.prairiechickens.org or emailing terrylydell@qualityci.us. The application will also be available soon from professors in their major departments. It will be formally released to the schools in mid April and then again in September. No deadlines have been set.





Register Soon for The 21st Annual Detroit Lakes Festival of Birds

The Detroit Lakes Bird Festival is May 16-19 and this year's theme bird is the American Bittern. The festival kicks off this year on Wednesday evening with a delightful show, "For the Birds" at the Historic Holmes Theater. The show features a series of musical pieces celebrating our feathered friends and drawing parallels with our own human nature. On Thursday join new and familiar faces at Hub 41 for a social. Make sure you reserve your spot early for Friday evening's presentation by Carrol Henderson as he reflects on his 45-year career in the DNR. Saturday evening's Keynote speaker is Noah Strycker. Noah Strycker is a writer, photographer and birdman from Oregon. Strycker has written four books: *Among Penguins (2011), The Thing with Feathers (2014), Birding without Borders (2017) and Birds of the Photo Ark (2018).* In 2015, he set out on an epic quest spanning 41 countries on all seven continents to set a world record by observing 6042 species of birds in one calendar year! He has worked on research in the polar regions, Amazonian Ecuador, Costa Rica, Panama and more. Of course, there are daily birding trips, a silent auction and more!

Preregistration deadline is Friday, May 11th. On-site registrations will be available at the DL Regional Chamber of Commerce Wednesday-Friday and at the M state College during the event, however, early registration is strongly recommended as field trip and workshop space is limited. Register by Tuesday, May 1st to be included in the special 'Early Bird Drawing' for a pair of 8.5x32 binoculars from Vortex. Register online to secure your spot! Go to www.VisitDetroitLakes.com. Registration is found under Events, then Festival of Birds. To date there are 60 registered with some coming all the way from New Mexico, California, Connecticut and even a few from the Netherlands!
